

## Water Supply Decreasing




- CO to warm 4°F by 2050
  - Increases in evaporation
  - Lower elevation snowpack decline
  - Timing of runoff to shift earlier
- CO in "transition zone" on precipitation
  - More winter precipitation, less in summer?



## Population Increasing



- Doubling of population 2010-2040
  - CO top 6 for growth last 35 yrs
- Lots of land use decisions to accommodate this growth





#### Land Use Terms



#### Comprehensive Plan

- Community goals/aspirations for future development dictates public policy for transportation, utilities, land use, recreation, and housing.
- Big scale, long-term.

#### Zoning Ordinances

- Separate uses of land based on mapped zones often includes building height and lot coverage requirements.
- Mechanism for implementing the Comp Plan.

## • Subdivision/Site Plan Regulations/Plumbing & Building Code

- Divide property into legal parcels. Establish position of streets, drainage, parking, utilities, landscaping.
- Some of the nitty gritty details.

#### Water Element in the Comp Plan

- Goals, objectives, strategies, techniques
- Existing assessment via questions
- Integrating Water throughout Comp Plan
  - As a stand-alone alternative
- Encouraging W.E. Land Use Patterns
  - It's all about density, folks!
  - Urban Growth Boundaries
  - Cluster/Infill Development
  - Multi-Family & Attached Housing



# Zoning



- Accessory dwelling units
  - Hot hot in CO
- Conditionally permitted uses
  - Be wary of high water users
- Planned Unit Development
  - Negotiate negotiate
- Floating zones
  - Encourage more w.e. land use types




Infill – make it easy!

# Subdivision/Site Plan Regulations



- Cluster Development Subdivisions
  - Density bonus for more open space
- Documentation of Water Supply Adequacy
  - State dependent
- Pre-Application Conference
  - Free to applicant, meet with utilities, fire, etc...
- Refer Application to Other Agencies
  - To gather outside expertise
- Landscape Code
  - Plant list, turf limits, soil amendment, irrigation system requirements



## Non-Zoning Incentives



- Financial Incentives for W.E. Development
  - Fee reduction, grants/loans, tax abatement
- Process Incentives to Encourage W.E.
  - Fast-track permitting, priority inspections, guaranteed timeline
- Assistance, Education, and Marketing Incentives
